



Proposed Fee Schedule Changes – Environmental Health

November 25, 2024

The Environmental Health division of the Weber-Morgan Health Department is proposing the following fee schedule changes:

Substantial Changes (Fees):

- Updated Temporary Establishment Permit late fees to follow the Weber-Morgan Health Department Regulation for Food Service Sanitation:
 - 9-201.12(B) – To qualify for a permit, an applicant shall submit an application and fee at least five (5) working days prior to start of the event, for a temporary establishment or prior to operating at the first event for a seasonal temporary establishment. Failure to do so may result in increased fee or denial of permit. Each day of application after the five (5) working days prior to the event the fee will increase by twenty five percent (25%).
- Added a new fee of \$230, “Change of Ownership Fee” for food establishments that undergo an ownership change.
- The Conference of Local Environmental Health Administrators (CLEHA) voted and approved an update to the mobile food business fees:
 - Tier I - \$350
 - Tier II - \$500

*Permit fees are required by rule to be uniform statewide [R392-102-4(5)(a)]
- Removed plan review and permit fees for Dogs on Patios.
 - Dogs are now permitted in outdoor dining areas under the 2022 FDA Food Code and Utah Food Service Sanitation Rule [R392-100].

Minor Changes (Language):

- Removed “/yr” from the “Sampling Permit 3/6/12-Month” fee.
- Changed “food worker” to “food handler” in multiple locations.
- Changed “Mobile Food Truck Primary Permit” to “Mobile Food Business Permit”.
 - Also updated the Tier I and Tier II descriptions to match the language in the Mobile Food Business Rule [R392-102].
